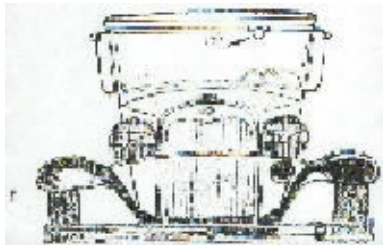

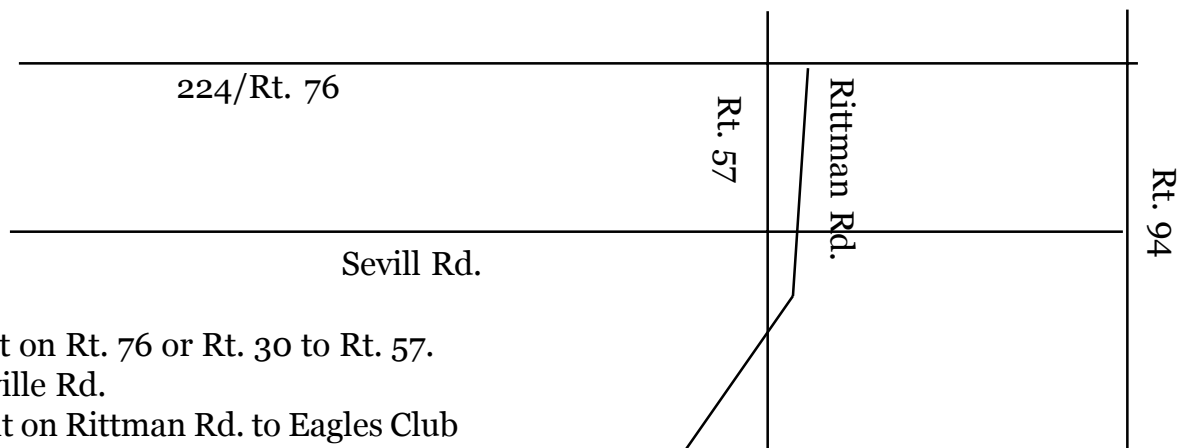

Tire Size and Ratio

I'm often asked the question, "How much difference does tire size or gear ratio make?" I've decided to make a chart including overdrive ratios to show what is gained in M.P.H..

The chart that I have done has all speeds shown at 2000 RMP--comfortable cruising engine speed.

As seen by this chart, tire size does matter a lot. And when using overdrive, the stock ratio of 3.78:1 is preferred. Because of the overdrive, you don't have to run 2,000 rpms to cruise. You can run lower engine rpms at a comfortable speed and in quiet comfort. An added bonus is the increase in gas mileage and engine longevity.

In order to run overdrive, a high compression head is a must to have enough torque to pull the high gear.

Have you ever had a hard time getting bugs and such off of your car? I have found a product that really cuts the amount of time needed to scrub bugs, tar or even road paint off of your car. The Mister Clean Magic Eraser works great and doesn't leave scratches. I recently got road paint on my car and tried several things to remove it without succes. My wife suggested the magic eraser and the paint came off with some elbow grease.

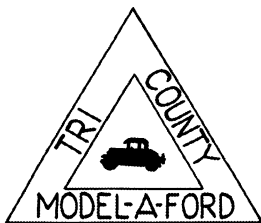


Five Points Correspondents: Sharon Lininger

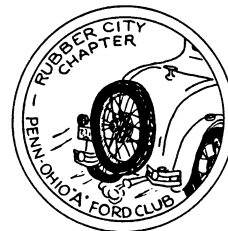
President Ferguson called the meeting to order and turned it over to the new President Carol Bechtel.

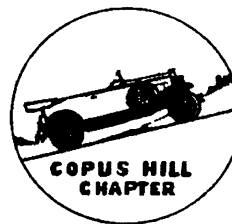
the club will vote at our March meeting before all is put into writing. Also, the club voted to accept the following members as NEO's 2011 Board:

The second car that I ever purchased is a 1929 Model “A” Ford Tudor Sedan. I still have this car. This car has lots of memories. The Tudor has been on many Penn-Ohio tours as well as several MARC National meets. It is painted Vagabond Green with Rock Moss Green trim. Hence its name – The Greene Machine. Sometimes this car is also referred to as AZ 29 which is the historical license plate for the car. It is an amazing combination because it includes the initials of my late father-in-law and the year of the car.

Next is Big Red. This is our 1931 Pickup Truck. This truck was black when my brother Jack purchased it quite a few years ago. My Dad and I put a quick paint job on it just before Jack was transferred to Texas and took the pickup with him. After several years in Texas with a few short trips where the truck would occasionally leave Jack high and dry, he presented me with the title one Christmas. All I had to do was to get it back to Ohio. Bet you wish you had a brother like Jack. Several years after Big Red returned to Ohio, it was re-restored in memory of our Dad Paul W. Greene. Jack comes back to Ohio every year to join us on the Penn-Ohio tour and his truck is always waiting for him. Big Red’s alternate name is PWG SONS which is the license plate for this truck.

Next is Old Yeller. This is our 1931 Canadian Cabriolet which is also known by its license plate CANACAB. This is a fun car to drive and has been on most of the Penn-Ohio tours since 2003. We use Old Yeller to take the grandkids to the root beer stand in the summer.

My current project is called Black and Blue. This is a 1931 slant windshield Fordor Sedan and is so named because of the color combination of Lombard Blue and Black. With any luck this car will be on the road in 2012.

While I have most of the details worked out in my mind for my next project, I don’t have a name associated with it yet. The plans are that it will be a 1930 boat tail speedster, probably white with red trim. Maybe I’ll have to break tradition and just call it the Speedster. I have plenty of time to think about it.
