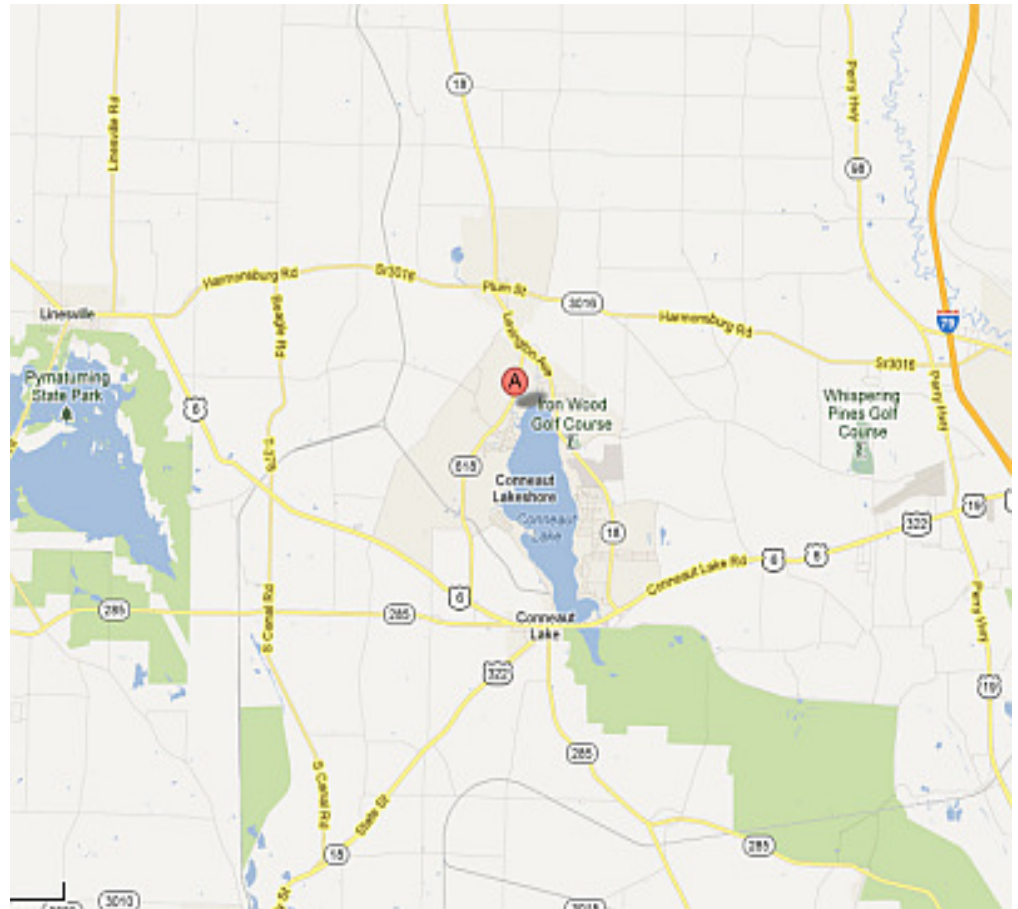

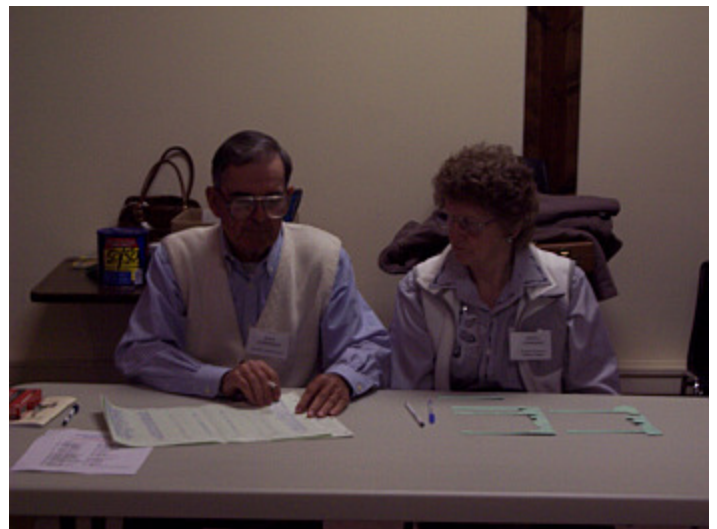

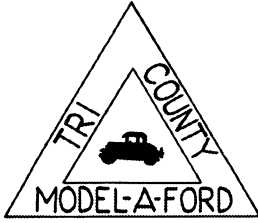


Picture of Herb Saylor showing Director Terry Zavacky his very first dollar bill.

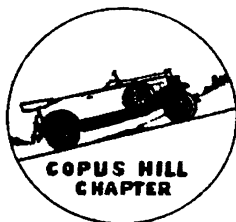

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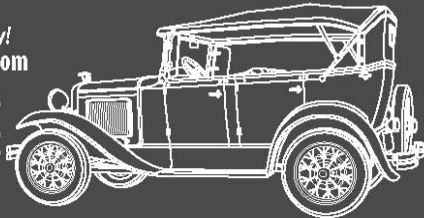
