

YOUNGSTOWN STEEL WHEEL REMINDER

In case you have had a change in your June plans and are thinking about the Penn Ohio tour, here is a recap of why you won't want to miss the tour!!!

After checking in on Sunday, June 18th, and getting your tour packet along with a brief orientation, the tour group will be treated to Pizza Wars! Tour participants

will get to enjoy pizzas from several establishments and cast ballots for the tastiest pizzas! The Mahoning Valley has had strong ethnic influences as immigrants came to the valley for the jobs available with the steel industry, and weaving a legacy of great foods into our culture.

Topping off the Pizza Wars experience will be a Handel's Ice Cream tour with plenty of flavors to satisfy any serious ice cream lover! Here's some background on Handel's Ice Cream: "On a hot summer day in July, 1945, Alice Handel began serving ice cream out of her husband's gas station in Youngstown, Ohio. Her first batches were made using old fashioned recipes with fresh fruit that she picked from her own backyard. Handel's Homemade Ice Cream & Yogurt is made fresh daily, one batch at a time, at each location, using products, equipment, methods and recipes exclusive only to Handel's." Sounds pretty tasty, doesn't it???

We tour the Mahoning Valley over the next 4 days and experience history, architecture, interesting sites that are unique to our area.

We will tour the Butler Museum, which was founded in 1919 by Joseph G. Butler, Jr. The Butler Institute is the first museum of American art. On permanent display is a Norman Rockwell's 85 inch tall masterpiece named "Lincoln the Rail Splitter". Also on the tour is *Greystone*, the magnificent arts and craft style residence of Olive A. and Wilford P. Arms, which is preserved a century later as The Arms Family Museum of Local History. Artifacts displayed and interpreted here are in changing galleries that help the visitor understand the way of life in the Mahoning Valley for different people at different times, whether Native American, pioneer settler, Welsh coal miner, African American freeman, or Eastern European immigrant.

There is still much more to see and do on this tour. Make sure you reserve your spot today! This is a hub tour out of a newer Hampton Inn and the driving will be in small increments. Great lunches are included in the tour package. Three dinners will be on your own, except for the Banquet on Thursday night. There are eateries within a short walk from the hotel. 

For Sale: 1931 (standard black) Tudor driving Model "A" for sale. Motor was rebuilt 8000 miles ago and insert bearings were installed. The car has an electronic ignition system, an emergency shutoff on the electrical system and when you turn the key off, it automatically shuts off the gas. It has a touring cam bored out 40 over, an S10, 5 speed transmission (the trailing arm, which can bend on this transmission I had engineered beefed up to take care of that problem. However, I have not installed it yet but it comes with the car.) The original "A" transmission comes with the car. For our comfort in touring with this car, I had installed 16" radial tires. The front axle has been bent so the wheels are straight up and down to improve steering and handling. New brakes were installed 2000 miles ago and there are cast iron drums on the front axle only. It has a complete 12 volt system with a CB radio installed over the windshield. It comes with a wolf whistle and an exhaust whistle. Included with the car is a large selection of parts: (3) 16" rims and (2) 19" rims (the 19" rims have Firestone blackwall tires on them). This is a traveling car. It has been from Toledo, OH to Maine and back and from Toledo to Mackinaw and back. It has also been driven to Key West from Lake Wales, Fl and back. This is a driving car not a show car. The condition of the car on a scale of 1 to 10 is about a 7. We are also offering as a package deal an enclosed trailer that we used to haul the "A" to Florida and back. It is a 2006, 24 foot trailer in fair condition. In the front of the trailer is a work bench and plenty of cabinet space for storing things. Also included, is the equalizer trailer hitch.
