Thousand Island Tour

June 14 through June 19

The tour will start in Alexandria Bay, NY. Registration will be on Sunday, June 14th at Riveredge Resort. We are doing this tour like a MARC meet and you will be on your own to get there.

Suggested route to Alexandria Bay:

Going through Erie on 90 East can be hectic even though the speed limit is 55. No one seems to go that slow. Once you are in New York, the suggested route is 86 East. Very light traffic and four lanes so traffic can get by the slower moving Model A. Take Route 86 East to Bath, NY. Then Route 54 North to Route 14 North to Route 104 East to Route 3 North to Route 81 North at Watertown, NY. Above Watertown traffic is very light on 81 North. Take that to Exit 50N. Go 3.5 miles to the first red light. Turn left onto Church Street (under the Alexandria Bay Arch). Go down a few blocks and turn right onto Walton Street. About three blocks after the turn onto Walton Street, turn left onto Holland Street. Riveredge Resort is straight ahead.

You must have your passport or passport card prior to the tour if you wish to drive into Canada. Fort Henry in Kingston, Ontario is a 40 mile drive each way. This is not included in our tour but worth a visit if you want an alternative event.

We will be staying in Alexandria Bay at the Riveredge Resort. This is located right on the St. Lawrence Seaway across from the Boldt Castle. The price is \$950 per couple. Price will include all the events, hotel and banquet. All other meals are on your own. You will be able to walk into town and there are many unique shops and restaurants. It is also not far to Clayton, NY, which also has a nice main street on the St. Lawrence with unique stores and restaurants. Watertown is not a far drive if you prefer chain restaurants.





The first use of "canned laughter" or the Laugh Track was in 1950 on NBC's 'The Hank McCune Show'.

MTV first aired at 12:01 AM on August 1, 1981. The first video was "Video Killed the Radio Star" by the Buggles.

The first toilet ever seen on television was on "Leave It to Beaver."

On 3 April 1962, the U.S. Air Force announced it had successfully completed the first satellite TV broadcast.




