

On March 11, 2017, we had our annual Pizza Meet at the Westwood Alliance Church in Mansfield, OH. It was hosted by Neal, Lindsay, & Carson Franzen and also Tom & Sally Franzen. We had a smaller group than normal because of a lot of sickness within the Chapter. We had a nice variety of pizza and lots of desserts and salads to go around.

After our short business meeting, we introduced our guest speaker of the day. WWII Veteran, Mr. Bill Wynne of Mansfield who was born in Scranton Pennsyvlvania on March 29, 1922. He will be 92 years young. Also along to assist him was his son, Bob. Mr. Wynne told us one of the stories of his Smoky the War Dog that earned two Medals of Honor, eight Battle Stars, and two Presidential Unit Citations to become one of the five greatest war dogs in U.S. history. The Highest and Most Rare Honor an Animal Hero can receive is the Australian Purple Cross. Smoky is only the ninth to receive the Purple Cross in 162 years. She also became the No. 1 mascot of the South Pacific and the worlds first official therapy dog on record. Smoky was a small four-pound Yorkshire Terrier. Smoky participated in 12 combat missions, flying reconnaissance flights over Japanese Territory; she became the basis for today's therapy dog programs and went on to become a famous entertainer in the U.S. after the war. Mr. Wynne told us many interesting stories about himself and his Yorkie during the war. He also brought along his Yorkie that he has now to show us how small they really are. After all the questions from the members were answered, everyone that attended purchased one of Mr. Wynne's book that he authored. We were all honored to have him personally sign them for us.



For Sale: 1931 (standard black) Tudor driving Model "A" for sale. Motor was rebuilt 8000 miles ago and insert bearings were installed. The car has an electronic ignition system, an emergency shutoff on the electrical system and when you turn the key off, it automatically shuts off the gas. It has a touring cam bored out 40 over, an S10, 5 speed transmission (the trailing arm, which can bend on this transmission I had engineered beefed up to take care of that problem. However, I have not installed it yet but it comes with the car.) The original "A" transmission comes with the car. For our comfort in touring with this car, I had installed 16" radial tires. The front axle has been bent so the wheels are straight up and down to improve steering and handling. New brakes were installed 2000 miles ago and there are cast iron drums on the front axle only. It has a complete 12 volt system with a CB radio installed over the windshield. It comes with a wolf whistle and an exhaust whistle. Included with the car is a large selection of parts: (3) 16" rims and (2) 19" rims (the 19" rims have Firestone blackwall tires on them). This is a traveling car. It has been from Toledo, OH to Maine and back and from Toledo to Mackinaw and back. It has also been driven to Key West from Lake Wales, Fl and back. This is a driving car not a show car. The condition of the car on a scale of 1 to 10 is about a 7. We are also offering as a package deal an enclosed trailer that we used to haul the "A" to Florida and back. It is a 2006, 24 foot trailer in fair condition. In the front of the trailer is a work bench and plenty of cabinet space for storing things. Also included, is the equalizer trailer hitch.
