





Six Model "A's" and one modern car left Samosky's in Valley City for a scenic drive to Chippewa Lake to join our hosts, Don and Sharon Workman at their cottage for our annual picnic on Sunday, August

2nd. Our weather could not have been more perfect for a leisurely day at the lake. Five more "A's" and one modern car joined us for a great gathering of the Cranksters. Everyone brought something to share so we had a lot of great food as well as company for the event.



Saturday, August 22nd, found the Cranksters on their way to Marshallville Historic Days Parade. We had conflicting events for the last several years and been unable to attend so they were glad to see our cars once again in their parade and car show afterward. One of our cars even won a plaque for the best presentation of an antique car in the parade. Of course we ate at the many places available around the town. The rummage sale going on at one of the churches is always a great draw for us and many bargains were discovered!

Our annual overnight on September 12th and 13th began at McDonald's in Brunswick for an early start to the weekend. In spite of the light rain coming down on us we made great time on 303 with all of its hills and valleys. In Ravenna, we stopped at McDonald's

for a break and to walk around and stretch our legs. Then we headed to Salem and into Leetonia where the coke ovens reside. The Leetonia Iron and Coal Company constructed the complex of 200 Beehive Coke Ovens around 1866, later named the Cherry Valley Iron Works. The beehive coke ovens were built to turn coal into coke by removing the impurities from the coal. The coke than was used as fuel for

the furnaces that produced iron and steel. It stopped operations in the early 1930's at the height of the Great Depression. The rain had stopped when we got to the ovens and we were able to walk around and inspect the various sizes of the ovens that have begun to fall down over the years. There must have been horrendous amounts of air pollution from the entire process of making the coke—long before the EPA! We then headed back to Salem where we visited the Charles E. Burchfield Homestead—a well-known watercolor artist in the early 1900's who lived in Salem for part of his life. By then, the rain was coming down harder so it was nice to be inside enjoying a drier outing. We had a tour of the house and heard about his paintings by a very dedicated docent. After a little quiet time at the hotel, it was out to dinner



at Annabell's. With the bridge out just near the restaurant, we had quite a detour to get there but made it all intact. Our dinner was at one long table and we proved to be quite the boisterous group but luckily were not asked to leave! Back at the hotel the game Apples to Apples come out as we gathered around the tables we had pushed together in the lobby. 
