

2018 PENN-OHIO LAKE ERIE SHORES TOUR

August 13-18, 2018 (Mon.-Sat.)

The Lake Erie Shores Tour will cover four counties in Northeast Ohio: Cuyahoga, Lake, Geauga and Ashtabula, and will be 6 days long. The **month has been changed** for the tour in order to include a yearly event in Conneaut, Ohio, which is the D-Day Re-enactment of the invasion of Normandy, France. This is the largest D-Day (WWII) living history re-enactment in the country which takes place on the shores of Lake Erie. You will witness plenty of heavy artillery in action.

Also included is a Sightseeing City Tour of Cleveland, with more than 100 points of interest, on Lolly the Trolley, with lunch included at Crop Bistro in Ohio City. The restaurant is housed inside the 9 story United Bank Building built in 1923. We will be dining inside The Vault. Afterwards, we will begin our second tour of the day which includes President Garfield's Memorial and Wade Chapel. We will also learn about some famous people who are buried in Lake View Cemetery's beautiful garden of unusual trees and flowers from around the world. You will not be driving your Model A's to Cleveland as we have contracted buses to do the driving for us.

The total actual cost has not yet been determined as we are still in the planning stages for the banquet also. To give you an idea, it may be approximately \$1000 or less per couple & singles \$800 or less. The more people that come on the tour to fill the 2 buses & 3 trolleys, the cheaper it will be. Payments may be made in increments beginning with a \$300 down payment included with your registration form.

Please email or call us if you plan on coming on the tour. This will give us an idea sooner of the number of people to expect in reserving the hotel rooms instead of depending on the mail. We will be staying at Quail Hollow Resort in Concord Township which is currently being renovated. The rental of buses and trolleys do not charge by the number of people but by the number of vehicles needed. Once we know the number of people coming, we can then let you know the actual cost of the trip.

So...mark your calendars with the **change of date for the tour**. We hope that many of you will be joining us on the Lake Erie Shores Tour as we also explore many covered bridges, wineries, and historical places here in Northeast Ohio. This is sure to be a very fun time for all.


